Prof. Aleksandra Kuzior

Aleksandra Kuzior is a habilitated doctor and Professor at the Silesian University of Technology, honoured with multiple *Doctor Honoris Causa* titles. Her scientific interests include sustainable development, business ethics, Smart Cities, safety management, artificial intelligence, and cognitive technologies.

At the Faculty of Organization and Management of the Silesian University of Technology, she serves as Dean and Head of the Department of Applied Social Sciences.

She is also President of the Silesian Centre of Business Ethics and Sustainable Development, Vice-President of the Polish Association for Technology Assessment, and a project evaluation expert for the Scientific Grant Agency of the Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sport and the Slovak Academy of Sciences (VEGA), as well as for the National Research Foundation of Ukraine.

She has managed nine completed projects financed by the European Social Fund, the Polish National Centre for Research and Development, and the Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange, in cooperation with foreign partners.

She is the author of over 300 scientific publications. Her Hirsch Index is 26 in Scopus and 17 in Web of Science (WoS), with a total impact factor of 151.497.

She has received numerous awards, including:

- the Special Award *Black Diamond* from the Regional Chamber of Commerce and Industry of the Rybnik Industrial District (2018),
- the Silesian Scientific Award (2017),
- the Medal of the National Education Commission (2015),
- the Award of the Minister of Education and Science for organisational activity (2021),
- the Medal of the Polish Chamber of Ecology for contributions to sustainable development (2023).
