

## **REGULATIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL COSTUME PARTY**

### **§ 1. General Provisions**

1. These Regulations set out the rules for participation in the event “**International Costume Party**”, hereinafter referred to as the “Event”.
2. The organizer of the Event is the **Welcome Point of the Silesian University of Technology**, hereinafter referred to as the “Organizer”.
3. The Event will take place on **10 February 2026 at 5:00 p.m.** at the **Staff Club of the Silesian University of Technology**.
4. These Regulations are available prior to and during the Event and are binding on all participants.

### **§ 2. Purpose and Nature of the Event**

1. The purpose of the Event is to integrate the international community of the Silesian University of Technology, in particular students, doctoral candidates, employees, and their families.
2. The Event is of a cultural and integration-oriented nature and is open to eligible persons in accordance with § 3 of these Regulations.

### **§ 3. Participants of the Event**

1. The following persons are entitled to participate in the Event:
  1. students of the Silesian University of Technology,
  2. doctoral candidates of the Silesian University of Technology,
  3. employees of the Silesian University of Technology,
  4. family members of the persons referred to in points 1–3, including children.
2. Participation in the Event is voluntary.
3. Minors may participate in the Event only under the supervision of adults.

### **§ 4. Registration and Conditions of Participation**

1. A prerequisite for participation in the Event is prior registration via the registration form made available by the Organizer.
2. Registration is open until **6 February 2026 at 12:00 p.m.**
3. Persons who fail to register within the specified deadline will not be admitted to the Event venue.

4. The Organizer reserves the right to verify registration upon entry to the Event.
5. The number of places at the Event is limited. Participation is determined by the order of correctly submitted registrations.

## **§ 5. Organizational and Order Rules**

1. Participants of the Event are obliged to:
  1. comply with these Regulations,
  2. follow the instructions of the Organizer and persons acting on its behalf,
  3. observe the principles of social coexistence and respect other participants.
2. The Organizer encourages participants to wear carnival costumes or traditional outfits characteristic of their country of origin, provided that such attire does not violate public order, good manners, or applicable law.
3. It is prohibited to bring dangerous items, prohibited substances, or alcohol onto the Event premises.
4. The Organizer has the right to refuse participation in the Event or remove from the premises any person who violates these Regulations, applicable law, or poses a threat to other participants.

## **§ 6. Liability**

1. The Organizer shall not be liable for personal belongings of participants that are lost, damaged, or stolen during the Event.
2. Participants shall be liable for any damage caused by them to third parties or to the Organizer's property.
3. The Organizer shall not be liable for random events beyond its control.

## **§ 7. Image Rights**

1. Participation in the Event constitutes consent to the free-of-charge recording and dissemination of the participant's image in photographic and video materials produced during the Event for the Organizer's informational, promotional, and documentary purposes.
2. The consent referred to in section 1 includes, in particular, the publication of the participant's image on websites and social media channels of the Silesian University of Technology and the Welcome Point.

## **§ 8. Personal Data Protection**

1. Participants' personal data are processed solely for the purpose of organizing and conducting the Event, in accordance with applicable laws, in particular the GDPR.

2. Providing personal data is voluntary but necessary for registration and participation in the Event.

## **§ 9. Final Provisions**

1. The Organizer reserves the right to determine and modify the substantive and time-related course of the Event, including changing its form or terminating it immediately in the event of force majeure.
2. The Organizer shall not be liable for the effects of force majeure. Force majeure shall mean an event beyond the Organizer's control that renders the performance of obligations impossible or may be deemed impossible due to the circumstances. Force majeure includes, in particular: adverse weather conditions, failures or disruptions in electricity supply systems, and the COVID-19 pandemic.
3. Matters not regulated by these Regulations shall be decided by the Organizer.
4. These Regulations shall enter into force on the date of their publication.
